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Dear Pula Players,

The festival has started and three days have passed in a blink of an eye. As you can see from smiling faces everywhere you look everybody is having fun and enjoying seaside and playing some phenomenal bridge!

We are happy to announce that few days ago we passed 500 registered players, and in all tournaments so far we have the roughly same numbers as in 2024.

It seems that weather will be warm throughout the festival, although there is a slight possibility of rain on Tuesday, other than that we are expecting lot of sun and daily temperatures of about 25 Celsius, and the sea is still warm, 23-24 Celsius.

On Sunday two concurrent team tournaments were played. They are mixed teams and non mixed teams former having 36 register teams and latter having 27 teams. OPEN MINI TEAMS

Board-a-match

Monday, noon

We continue our festival with another team event, board-a-match.

Board-a-match is a type of scoring where one could say that it is a team tournament scored like pairs. You compare your scores only with your teammates, but regardless of the difference in points you can only gain 2VP on every board. So on every board you can win the board (2VPs), tie the board (1VP) or lose the board (0VPs). Imagine you are playing pairs tournament on only 2 tables, so be alert and don't let any tricks disappear.

Last year we had 57 teams, and and this year we have 30 registered teams but there is still time to register and we know that bridge players like to postpone commitment until very end. Even so it seems that although we have over 500 participants at the festival, half of them enjoy sun and sea and took some break from playing cards:). We are starting as all teams tournament at noon, and at BAM we will have short break from about 4 p.m to 5 p.m.

Couple of more reminders:

For all the tournaments you will pay at the table. Please prepare exact amount of money.

You are responsible for entering the correct result into BridgeMate. If you, however, somehow miss-score, there is only very short time available to make corrections: one hour after the tournament. We cannot accept later complains so please, just check the result after every board. Soon after the tournament unofficial results will be published and you will have one hour to report an error. You have to do it by sending email to pulabridge@gmail.com.

Once you have registered, there is nothing much you should do before the tournament except arrive to the playing room 15 minutes before the start (11.45 a.m. for this tournament) and find your table. Positions will be displayed online one hour before the start (11 a.m.), again, at pulabridgefestival.com.

We will play 7 rounds, 6 hands per round. One round is 50 minutes and there is a small break between rounds.

It is the best to leave your mobile phone in your room, but if you take it with you it should be shut down, and left in an visible place near you. Be warned that having a mobile phone that is not openly displayed at the table is illegal, and so is looking at it at any point. Tournament directors will not be happy if they see you looking at your phone, and it could again cost you, guess what: VPs. If there is a real need for you to use a phone during the tournament you should ask TD and he/she will help.

We encourage you strongly to be friendly towards your partner, opponents, officials, bartenders and all other beings you encounter. Remember how lucky we all are that we can be all together here again and for a week worry only about IMPs and MPs.



Interview: Christina Lund Madsen

In this issue of **Good morning bridge**, we bring you an exclusive interview with Christina Lund Madsen, Denmark best female player

Yet another European, world, universe champion is with us today. Maybe you have noticed that we tend to interview women. It is true and there is a good reason for that - we prefer to keep our bulletin visually attractive. This is also descrete hint for all male players to put some effort into their appearance if they want to be interviewed.

So another beautiful woman it is. Welcome to Pula Christina,

How do you like it so far? Who are you going to play with, what are your expectations in terms of results and else?

Firstly, I love the venue! I had very high expectations because Croatia might be my favourite country to travel in within Europe and I even went to Pula before I ever attended the festival (this is my first time) just to chck out the surroundings. This venue is no less than perfect for a bridge festival. I will be disappointed if there will not be at least one occasion when someone goes for a naked night swim...

I would like to say something nice about the organization, but since I just checked in and immediately had to answer 37 questions, I don't even know if there is a bar yet.

My partner here is Laura Lipman from USA, one of my favourite partners. I forced her to come here and she willingly accepted despite three flights and 6 hours of time difference.

There are rumors in the bridge circles that you do not have golden boots, is that true? Please comment if the question is not too intimate and if it is, explain in details why it is so.

Yet again a question that led me to desperate measures. I brought a golden skirt that I will bet is shorter than your boots... that will also not be revealed until the BAM.

I do not have golden boots, but I have a very good excuse for that. The last pair of boots I owned had a sad ending. I came home from an interesting night and was mildly intoxicated. I could not get one of my boots off, and being too drunk and too exhausted to sleep with the boot on, I decided it would be a great idea to simply cut it open down along the zipper.

Let's just say that didn't seem like such a great idea when I woke up the next morning...

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Interview: Christina Lund Madsen

You are a professional player. What does it mean? How does your work day look like? What are the upsides and what are the downsides of this unconventional profession?

I will give you three answers and you can see which matches the best and what you think are the upsides and downsides:

I get up around 9 in the morning, I check the news on my phone, maybe do some laundry. If the weather is nice, I sit on my terrace in the sun and then I meet my friends for dinner and wine in the evening. I feel bad I didn't make any money that day, but after two glasses of wine I don't care anymore.

I get up around 9 in the morning. I bid a little on



cuebids, send some emails, go for a run and say hi to my kids when they come home from school. At 3 I play on BBO, then I cook for the kids and then I play again at 7 on BBO. I talk to my partner on the phone afterwards and the kids say: "Mom, you don't have to yell though she is in America. She can hear you through the phone."

I get up around 9 in the morning. My mixed partner has sent me an additional 5 pages to add to the 39 other pages of system notes I need to read before the morning match at 10. I skip breakfast and have a coke instead. I meet Bas and pretend I know the system. During the first match he sees I clearly

don't. We lose by 8 and now have to win all our remaining matches to qualify. I finally manage to remember the system, and we qualify in last position. We have team dinner in the evening and celebrate we qualified, and our captain Sjoert Brink claims we are going to win the tournament. We laugh at him and he wants to bet, and 5 days later one of our teammates has to dance Macarena in the restaurant because we won the tournament.

Do you prefer playing with a man or a woman, are there any consistent differences or it is all the same?

I don't have any preference playing with men or women. It is about the person, not the sex. All my partners have very different personalities, so I adapt to my partner. If you ask whether I think women are as good at bridge, the answer is no, and there are many explanations for that, which is a debate I will not enter here. Just shortly say it is partly cultural, partly the women's own lack of ambition and dedication.

That being said, there are definitely women as good as men and they are perhaps better partners. I have sometimes played both with and against men who don't have enough respect for women. I didn't go well for them on any occasion. If they underestimate me as their partner, it is wrong, and if they underestimate me as their opponent, that is wrong too.

What is the most important thing you request from your partner and what is your own best bridge feature?

That they trust and respect me. As for my own best feature, I think I would say that I am fearless.

You are also bridge journalist and a quite successful one – here we are hoping you will write something for Good Morning Bridge too – but first, how did you start your journalist career? What do you like most about journalist work?

Here I was hoping that if I respond to this interview with 4 pages I don't have to write anymore the rest of the time...

Interview: Christina Lund Madsen

I have a university degree in journalism and did my master thesis on interviews. I very quickly got sucked into the bridge world so I didn't work long as a "normal" journalist though I liked it. People are the most interesting thing in the world. I don't write much anymore apart from occasional interviews with bridge players or when a friend of mine forces me to write something in their bulletin.

What do you do when you don't play bridge, what are your interests and passions?

Reading fantasy, dreaming about writing a book, dreaming about working out and usually just end up watching Netflix with my kids. I also do other things, but not sure it is suitable content for the bulletin.


Please give us an interesting board from IMP tournament.

"A-LEAGUE OF THEIR OWN": ECCE MULLER (Part 2)



Welcome back to my 2025 Gonzo Journalism series, which features a Goodmorning Bridge exclusive –the first-ever lurid exposé of BICWAYTANA: Bridge-In-Croatia-When-All-You-Tourists-Are-NOT-Around.

Curated for your connoisseur palates are some of the most memorable hands from Croatian "A-Liga" - which means most memorable by me because I am the author, and they are most memorable because they were declared by my brilliant partner, because if I had been at the helm these articles would likely not be covering these deals at all. So once again in the spotlight will be Croatian luminary Renata Muller

In the first episode of our series Renata brought home a touch-and-go 3N via a somewhat symmetrical pair of threatened throw-ins against each defender. Just a few boards later in the same match, she was again in 3N on the following layout after the auction shown below.

While the main focus is on her play, we first note she did VERY well in the auction -- 4♠ can fail on the lead of ♥10, and did in the other room (when the other declarer did not read the same ♥10 lead as a doubleton, and so did not duck ♥Q):



After a revealing period of deliberation West eventually led ▼10, with East contributing the Queen. A host of possibilities had to be considered now with respect to possible heart layouts, location of the key hostile honors, prospects for suit development, combining chances, etc. At some point however she had to do something, so she eventually emerged from the rather dizzying whirl of technical possibilities with the simple plan of trying for a friendly lie in clubs. This in itself did not represent a massive percentage, but it nevertheless seemed to offer the single best hope of solving issues -- and also for reducing immediate analytical angst, with all that attendant cerebral wear-and-tear. So she led a club to the Jack, which held.

It was slightly tempting now to exit dummy with a low club, so as to avoid having to discard twice from her hand, which might compromise the trick-generating capacity of her spade suit if the clubs failed to cooperate -- and also to avoid setting up an extra winner for the enemy in that scenario.

The obvious danger in that tactic, though, was that if the lead had been from K109x (or even fifth, though that seemed unlikely given how slowly the opening lead had appeared), RHO might be able to win a club pip and lead a heart through the Knave. Then if W had begun with ♣Kxx and the spade Ace along with ♥K109x, declarer would be going down in a contract that had been all set to make in cozy comfort once she had chosen to begin her campaign by attacking clubs.

Renata thus played Ace and another club to West, pitching spades while East threw a discouraging ♠7 on the third round. Assorted chances still remained, and declarer was happy to see LHO battle on with hearts. After winning with the King, though, East very revealingly abandoned that suit to advance ♠5, on which Renata played her King. It was painfully apparent to West that he would have no effective continuation if he won this trick -- a second spade to the Nine would be ducked to keep West off lead and thus strand ♣K, and meanwhile the rest of the spade suit would come in for declarer thus providing a ninth trick. Hence West smoothly ducked, but it was still totally clear which adversary had the Ace, given that spade shift by East who could instead presumably have established the hearts -- he was unlikely to have started with just two hearts for various reasons, such as the aforementioned suggestive huddle which had preceded the opening lead. In fact, West was unlikely on multiple grounds to have even as many as four hearts as well -- for example, East would almost surely have led a third heart to establish the long card in the West hand while his partner still held a spade entry. So here we all were at Trick 7, with this middle-game matrix left and lots of robust inferences at this point regarding the EW shape and high-card structure (as just reviewed):



In this position the defenders already had two tricks in, and still held the master club along with AJ. Reading the position accurately, Renata now played J with a view towards elimination and endplay. West discarded a small diamond on this trick, which very strongly suggested that the W shape was 3244 -- If holding only a doubleton spade West would surely have won A on the first round of that suit, and also East would have been extremely unlikely to let go a spade (as he had done) from any even number of cards when he had a completely risk-free diamond discard available.

Sometimes in such situations one sees declarer play the low diamond intending to finesse dummy's 10, in hopes of creating an extra entry which would allow the long club to be both established and cashed.

There were at least three reasons for rejecting such a risky, desperate maneuver:

- (i) An alert West would insert ◆J on the trick if he held it, killing the finesse and the second entry
- (ii) If the West hand were in fact 4234 with ◆J, Renata could achieve a second dummy entry with zero risk simply by cashing a top diamond in her hand and then leading her other honor. This would extract ◆J, whereupon South could overtake and establish the thirteenth club, with ◆10 still there in dummy to reach it;
- (iii) In any case, though, assuming West is indeed 3244 with ♠A the hand was cold all along, because that third round of hearts had squeezed West out of a surplus winner, forcing him to part with the long diamond.

So just as in scenario (ii) Renata began with •K then the Queen, waiting to see what card West produced on the second round. When it was not the Knave, she called low from dummy and then led a third round of the suit. West was now all set up for a throw-in via •K, and also for a throw-up when he was obliged to yield the ninth trick to declarer's •Q at the very end -- in the two-card end position, West was on lead with •AJ while Renata had •Q8. (Note also that if West had followed to •J in the sevencard matrix, his most likely shape by far would be 3334, which allows Renata to polish him off in identical fashion.)

As noted in Part 1, Job Security is a fine thing. Ah but in truth these first two end-plays have merely been amuse-gueules.... For further plucky escapades in the BICWAYTANA wilderness, tune in again for Part 3.

A Taste of Istria: Where the Mediterranean Meets Central Europe

Istria, the heart-shaped peninsula in Croatia's northwest, is more than just a region of sunlit coasts and medieval hilltop towns—it's one of Europe's most exciting culinary destinations. Truffles: The Crown Jewel

Autumn is truffle season, and visitors can join truffle-hunting tours with trained dogs before savoring their finds shaved over fuži (traditional Istrian pasta), scrambled eggs, or steak. White truffles, in particular, fetch global acclaim, placing Istria alongside Piedmont in Italy as a truffle capital.

Olive Oil: Liquid Gold

Istrian olive oil has been praised since Roman times, and today the region consistently wins awards at international competitions. Small, family-run estates line the countryside, producing intensely green oils with peppery notes. Tasting routes allow visitors to sample oils straight from the press, often paired with homemade bread, prosciutto, and cheeses. Olive oil here is not just an ingredient but a marker of cultural pride and continuity.



Wine: Malvazija and Teran

No Istrian table is complete without wine. Istria's vineyards thrive thanks to the Mediterranean climate, limestone-rich soil, and proximity to the Adriatic Sea. The signature white, **Malvazija Istarska**, is crisp, aromatic, and perfectly suited to seafood. On the red side, **Teran** is bold, earthy, and pairs beautifully with game and truffle-rich dishes. Many vineyards welcome guests for tours, often set among rolling hills that evoke Tuscany. Increasingly, young winemakers are experimenting with organic and natural methods, adding a modern twist to Istria's ancient viticulture.

Medica and Hard Spirits: Sweet Traditions

Istria is also home to **medica**, a sweet honey brandy, typically made by infusing local honey into distilled grape brandy (*loza*). Served as a digestif, medica is both a treat and a nod to Istria's folk remedies, historically believed to aid digestion.

Other traditional Istrian spirits include:

Loza: Clear grape brandy, often enjoyed neat or infused with herbs and fruits.

Rakija variants: Distilled from plums, pears, or cherries, these spirits are a staple at local festivals, weddings, and family gatherings.

The Sea on a Plate

Along the coast, seafood dominates. Freshly caught fish, scampi from Kvarner Bay, and cuttlefish find their way into grills, risottos, and pastas. One standout is **black risotto**, colored and flavored with cuttlefish ink—a dish as dramatic as it is delicious. Simplicity is key: fish is often served grilled with a drizzle of olive oil, garlic, and parsley, letting the Adriatic speak for itself.

Hearty Inland Fare

Inland Istria tells a different story, one of rustic comfort food. **Maneštra**, a bean and vegetable stew, warms tables in colder months, while **žgvacet**, a slow-cooked chicken goulash, reflects Central European roots. Homemade pasta such as pljukanci and fuži forms the base of many dishes, often enriched with wild asparagus in spring or truffles in autumn.

Sweet Endings and Spirits

For dessert, try **fritule** (small fried doughnuts, sometimes with raisins and brandy) or **kroštule**, crunchy pastries dusted with sugar. To end a meal, locals often turn to **biska**, a mistletoe-infused brandy, or **rakija** flavored with honey, herbs, or figs. These homemade spirits, offered with a smile in taverns and homes alike, symbolize Istrian hospitality.

Restaurant Kuglana

The closest restaurant to the venue, maybe 50 meters, between Histria and Park Plaza Verudela, right across the Histria Wing hotel. Lot of various dishes, from as simple as ham and eggs and pizza to Istrian and Croatian specialities. It is not expensive and you can get a decent dish for 15-20 euro. They usually do not take bookings as it is always crowded anyway. They also serve breakfast.



ENSTROS GRIL

Restaurant Boschetto

Very nice, friendly place near the tennis courts, 500 meters from the venue. Decent food and reasonable prices. This restaurant will probably host us for Madhatter's Karaoke Party. They will stay open every day until there are guests (2 a.m.). So this is the place to go after the tournaments for dinner or drinks. Most of other places around close at 11 or 12.

Restaurant Yacht Club

Only about 100 meters from the venue, down on the sea shore, one of Croatia best fish restaurants with breath-taking views. During the day you can also have a snack or just a cocktail and enjoy.

Reasonably priced for a restaurant of this level. For a bigger groups (especially in the evenings), booking is recommended.





Ribarska koliba

This is a famous fish restaurant about 20 minutes walk from the venue, in marina. You can see Ribarska koliba from windows of the main playing room. It is rather expensive and booking is usually required. Michelin Guide's Point Of View: This restaurant in the Ribarska Koliba Resort is situated near the Marina Veruda which can be admired through the large picture windows or from the restaurant's attractive terrace. Delicious Mediterranean cuisine takes pride of place on the menu, ranging from pasta-based starters to fish and seafood dishes made from the freshest ingredients, although a few meat-based specialities also feature.

Konoba Volme

This place is a bit further away, in Banjole, but it is worth visiting. It is a very nice restaurant with big terrace, very local and homey. Food is authentic Croatian, delicious and prices are in a lower range. You will need a car to get there. To make sure you get your table make a reservation +385 (98) 818265.



Restaurant Batelina (Gaultmillau review)



Restaurant Batelina is actually an old tavern in Banjole, a small town near Pula. It is not particularly decorated, nor does it have any advantages such as a garden, a special view or an interesting interior design, yet it is incredibly popular and it is very difficult to get a reservation. The first reason is the always fresh fish and seafood, but also the reduced working hours. An additional reason is certainly their famous chef David Skoko, a cook that appears almost every day on TV. Although he does not cook at Batelina on a daily basis, he is the one who creates the menu. The appetizers are varied and they serve 6 or 7 of them in small bowls or little plates:

marinated sardines, sardines in savor (fried and marinated), sea bass ceviche, pickled vegetables, salads... Our favourite was the grancigula, a delicious crab that is harder to find in restaurants these days. All dishes are based on a traditional and simple method of preparation. First of all, there are raw or grilled scampi, as well as various fish, depending on the day's catch, but also traditional cuttlefish brodetto, squid noodles with fried onions, which are definitely to recommend. If you expect top-quality dishes, prepared with imaginative culinary techniques, paired with wines, and all this in an elegant space – well, you won't find it here. Rather, we would say that Batelina is a tavern of "raw passions", basic, simple and traditional. Important notice: in Batelina they don't accept credit cards.


Sophia, Grand Hotel Brioni

Named after Sophia Loren who was frequent visitor of Brioni islands as a guest of ex-Yu president Josip Broz Tito, this place is a real gem.

Sophia restaurant is a premium meat specialist. Dine on the highest quality matured cuts of beef, including favourites like classic American steaks, but also local like Istrian Boskarin.

The atmosphere of this restaurant quickly puts a spell on their guests. Subdued lighting and darker color scheme create a mood that invites them to lower their guard and simply let the restaurant's specialties sweep them away. Expensive, but worth it.










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
